


The Forgotten, a printmaking exhibition curated by Teresa Lizamore, takes its cue from the untold – and often forgotten –narratives of many individuals embedded in South Africa's complex history. This exhibition challenges artists to interrogate individual histories with their unique narratives within a South African context. The Forgotten asks of participating artists to act as the authors of these untold narratives that attempt to unhinge the singular narrative which history may present.


The above mentioned conceptual statement is brought into relation with printmaking, as the complexities of South African histories are embedded in this medium. Printmaking became a popular medium in South Africa from the 1950's as an affordable, social and political tool, to disseminate knowledge and information about the anti-apartheid movement. Printmaking was seen as an antagonistic medium, looking to undo the linear narrative of South Africa. As a contemporary art medium of artistic expression, printmaking still

mimics the mechanical, industrial process that was associated with socio-political messages and is used by many printing studios as an affordable way for artists to learn and produce contemporary artwork. In his publication Impressions from South Africa, 1965 to Now: Prints from the Museum of Modern Art, Hecker (2006:11) explains that printmaking's "varied formats and broad reach means that it is particularly well suited to supporting a multiplicity of narratives". It is in these narratives that history may be retold or reconstructed.

In the current post-apartheid South African landscape, many South Africans try to renegotiate the collective contemporary South African history and consider narratives which were untold due to the history (of apartheid, segregation and power struggles). Diverting from the known (sanctioned) narrative this exhibition looks to the individual narrative and the artist as the author, challenging a linear timeline focusing on the 'forgotten' (his) stories within a South African context.















